Policy and Permission:
Construction, Tree Removal, Wood Clearing

CONSTRUCTION: Ground Rule 10.6 states, "Member site leaseholders must receive permission from the Director of Planning & Construction prior to any construction on their sites. Any construction or addition on Solair/LRI property must have a building permit from the Town of Woodstock displayed in full view. All buildings must conform to the building codes of the Town of Woodstock and Solair/LRI."

TREE REMOVAL: Ground Rule 10.7 states, "Before any tree larger than three (3) inches in diameter, as measured six (6) inches above the ground, on a member's site, may be cut, a form must be submitted to the Planning & Construction Director and will be placed in the Member's file upon approval. The Planning & Construction Director may delegate this responsibility to the Maintenance Manager."

WOOD CLEARING: Ground Rule 10.8 states, "All wood cut on Solair/LRI property shall remain for the use of the site leaseholder on his/her site, or be delivered to the corporation woodpile. In years where excess wood exists, it may be sold to individual affiliates, in rough form, for personal use at the discretion of the Planning & Construction Director. A Release of Liability Waiver must be signed and filed at the office."
